GENERAL ARTS AND SCIENCE - ENGLISH FOR ACADEMIC PURPOSES (EAPP)

Unlock your world by getting comfortable with the English language

Improve your English speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills and partake in the world around you. With this flexible learning program, you will upgrade your English skills to a level required for academic studies. You will combine classroom activities with off-campus excursions and dive into the English language and Canadian culture.

The program varies from four to 12 months, depending on your language abilities. Your English skills are assessed at the intake, and you are placed at a level appropriate for your language proficiency. When you reach Level B, the final level in EAPP, you can earn general education course credits and apply to enter regular programs at Cambrian College, including graduate certificate programs, provided you have the other admission requirements for the program.

The passing grade for all EAPP Levels is an average of 70%. Upon completing Level B, you may pursue a diploma in your chosen academic program. If you wish to pursue a post-graduate certificate and/or degree, you must obtain an 80% or greater in the following core courses: Reading II, Writing II, and Oral Communications II.

Admission requirements

Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) or equivalent from home country. Applicants with an OSSD showing senior English and/or mathematics courses at the Basic Level or with Workplace or Open courses will be tested to determine their eligibility for admission OR

- · Academic and Career Entrance (ACE) certificate, OR
- · General Educational Development (GED) certificate, OR
- Mature student status (19 years or older and without a high school diploma at the start of the program). Eligibility may be determined by academic achievement testing.

A language placement test is required.
